Bishop Wolfgang's Easter Message

At the crack of dawn on Sunday, the women came to the tomb carrying the burial spices they had prepared. They found the entrance stone rolled back from the tomb, so they walked in. But once inside, they couldn't find the body of the Master Jesus. They were puzzled, wondering what to make of this ... They left the tomb and broke the news of all this to the Eleven and the rest. Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them kept telling these things to the apostles, but the apostles didn't believe a word of it, thought they were making it all up. But Peter jumped to his feet and ran to the tomb. He stooped to look in and saw a few grave clothes, that's all. He walked away puzzled, shaking his head.

Luke 24 : 1 – 4a, 9 – 12, as paraphrased in "The Message"

Puzzlement, shock, unbelief, head shaking, fear: all of the Gospel writers report that the initial reaction to Jesus' resurrection from the dead was anything but glorious!

Let's be honest. How would YOU have reacted in this situation? In our human experience, dead people are just that – dead! They don't get up and walk around; they stay dead. The idea of a dead person coming back to life is so outside of our expectation, it's little wonder that the women and the disciples reacted with fear.

But with God, all things are possible, even the seemingly impossible (Matthew 19:26); and so this Jesus, this rabble rousing country preacher and miracle-worker who during his life time rattled everybody's cage and pushed everyone's envelope, once again defies the conventional. He defies even death itself and in the greatest miracle of all secures victory over death not just for himself, but for you, for me, for all of us.

With God, all things are possible. The world is full of miracles if only we look for them. I was reminded of this glorious truth recently when I read this month's newsletter of St. Mark Lutheran Church, Wilmington, Delaware. There was a quote from Martin Luther as an Easter message: "The conception and birth of every human creature ... is no less a miracle and wonder-work of God than that Adam was made out of a clod of earth, and Eve out of a fleshy rib. The world is full of such works of wonder," Luther preached on Easter Sunday 1544.

Oh that we would pay better attention and see God at work in our own lives! God creates wonder and miracles every day, we just have to look for all the blessings that flow from God. My prayer for you this Easter is that your faith may be strengthened, your life enriched by this message of Easter.

The body is gone! Jesus is alive! Do not be afraid!

From St. Martin's Principal's Desk

St. Martin's Student Sweeps Prizes at AA County Science Fair!

St. Martin's Lutheran School's sixth grader Meghan Chu swept the top prizes at the 2012 -2013 Anne Arundel County Science Fair!

The daughter of Dr. and Mrs. Nguyenanh Chu, Meghan's project addressed the question of which concentration level of Hydrogen Peroxide (H_2O_2) will whiten human teeth the most. Meghan prepared four different levels of concentration, 3%, 9.5%, 14%, and 40%, and applied each to human teeth for two 1-hour sessions, using a total of 36 teeth. After the applications, she rinsed and dried the teeth. She used a VITA Easyshade Compact to identify the shades of whiteness of the teeth before and after the experiment. Her data revealed that the 3% solution had no effect on whitening the teeth; however, the 40% solution whitened the teeth the most, thus corroborating her hypothesis: If different levels of concentration of hydrogen peroxide are applied to human teeth, the solution of 40% concentration will whiten teeth the most.

Meghan's project not only received the 1st place award at the Anne Arundel County Science Fair, but also took the Broadcom MASTERS (Math, Applied Science, Technology and Engineering for Rising Stars) Award. As a result of winning this award, Meghan will be a competitor in the national competition where the grand prize is \$25,000.

About the Bronze Sculpture...

"Joy" is the title of the bronze sculpture in the entryway/narthex. It is one of three pieces created together by sculptor Bob Miller. The other two pieces are in Iowa City, IA. This one is on loan to St. Martin's for a few more weeks.

How it was made: The artist began by forming, forging and welding the shape in steel. Wax was applied to coat the base metal and the sculpture was buried in sand. Molten bronze was poured into holes in the sand, migrated to the shape, melted the wax, and bonded to the steel. Once removed from the sand, the work was completed by buffing and polishing.

Inspiration for the piece: The artist was finishing an art degree and engaged to be married. Bob Miller is Pastor Mary's step-son.
