In consultation with the Congregation Council at St. Martin's, Bishop Wolfgang Herz-Lane has appointed me to serve as your vice pastor. When I got the call, I had a lot of questions and maybe you do too. Let me tell you what I've learned and what you might expect from me.

Pastor Mary served as your interim pastor. The vice pastor is like an interim pastor except not "in residence". I'm serving Our Shepherd Lutheran Church in Severna Park full time. The vice pastor has all of the "rights and responsibilities" of the called pastor. That means I'm available to you as the need arises. I will attend Congregation Council meetings and official meetings of the congregation as I am able. I will stop in the church office weekly. I will respond to your pastoral care needs, including hospital visits, funerals, and any other pastoral acts required outside of Sunday mornings. If for some reason I can't attend to those needs, I will find someone to cover for me. Your Congregation Council has made arrangements for a pastor to be present for worship on Sunday, so you won't see me there.

The role of vice pastor has restrictions or limitations. I will not participate or attempt to influence the selection of your next pastor, but I may assist in preparations for you to receive your next pastor.

Many of you know me already. I've served as the Dean of the Anne Arundel Conference for the past 4 years. In that capacity and at the request of the Bishop, I attended meetings while you were considering the motion to leave the ELCA. That was a difficult time for you as a congregation and it was a time that I held you in prayer.

I've been ordained for 23 years and have served three congregations in that time, in three different synods. Prior to entering Wartburg Seminary in Iowa, I worked as a Substance Abuse Therapist for 9 years. My undergraduate degree is in Psychology and Social Work. I am married to Lori (celebrating 35 years of marriage this year) who is a Clinical Social Worker. She has a private practice associated with Pastoral Counseling and Care Ministries and works at Baltimore Washington Medical Center in both the Psychiatric Emergency Department and the Psychiatric Unit of the hospital. We have two adult daughters, both are married and living within a couple of hours of us. There are no grandchildren (I often say I'm too young for that yet). When I'm not being husband or pastor, I can often be found on a bicycle. I ride every weekday morning and ridiculously long distances a couple of times a month. Some say that's what keeps me sane. That's generous.

## From The Council President

What a wonderful celebration we had on May 19 of Pastor Mary's ministry at St. Martin's! Thank you to all who participated in the planning, serving, performing, and contributing to this special event.

This will certainly be a summer of transition at St. Martin's. We hit the ground running on **June 9** when the candidate for our senior pastor position will officiate and preach during worship. As announced to the congregation on May 19, the candidate was unanimously selected by the call committee and unanimously and enthusiastically approved by the congregation council. Following worship, we will have a meet and greet session with the candidate and his spouse (newlyweds!) and then we will gather in the sanctuary for a formal vote.

Other items of business will be conducted at our **Congregational Meeting on June 9** including the presentation of the book of reports (which will be in electronic format to save printing costs), the approval of a three year plan for our congregation, the election of new council members, treasurers, and financial secretary, the election of endowment board members, and a brief presentation of our summer schedule.

Rather than appoint an "interim" interim pastor, Bishop Herz-Lane and I agreed that St. Martin's would best be served by a Vice Pastor. I am pleased that our friend and neighbor Reverend Earl Janssen from Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Severna Park has agreed to serve. Pastor Earl will be on call for visitations and other pastoral care and will also attend council meetings. Obviously, he will not be available to preach on Sunday which provides us an opportunity to hear different voices from the pulpit over the next two months or so. We already had the Bishop and Pastor Maberry lined up for the weeks prior to June 9. Marianne Drumm and the worship and music committee will work with Tim Smith to plan the worship services, and the committee and I will schedule guest pastors for the remaining weeks until our new senior pastor arrives.

So we anticipate a summer of "can't miss" Sundays with a lot of variety and excitement.

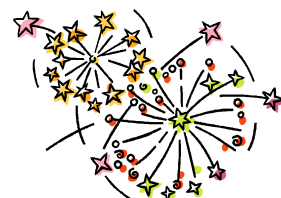

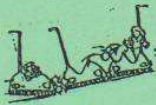

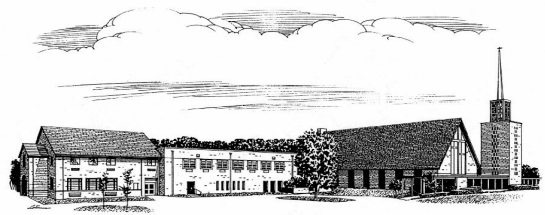
